






## **Harvest Festival**


This year's Harvest Festival is fast approaching and plans are well under way to celebrate it in school. Only the children

I would like to also extend the request for food donations to the rest of the school as well. I know that


many parents like to send in these traditional donations as they are given to such a wonderful cause. Thank you in advance for your support.

# **Dress down day for Oscar!**

Next Thursday, 10<sup>th</sup> October we are holding a non-uniform day for Oscar. Whilst Jemma's son, Freddie was receiving his treatment for cancer in Birmingham Children's hospital, he met Oscar.

Oscar is suffering from an acute form of Leukaemia and following numerous treatments including chemotherapy and a bone marrow transplant, sadly the cancer has returned.

The only chance he has of surviving this cruel disease is for his family to pay for some lifesaving treatment which isn't currently available on the NHS. The treatment costs £500,000 and the family only have eight weeks to raise the money. His appeal has gone nationwide and the support they are receiving is truly fantastic. They have raised just over £100,000 but they still have much further to go.

#### **Book Start Bear Club**

The Family Support Service have asked us to share some information with you on their "Book Start Bear Club".

This club is run by them for children aged 12 to 30 months where they enjoy sharing books and stories, bringing stories alive through

puppets and props, bringing stories alive through fun drawing and having fun sharing rhymes. If you would like to take part with your child, you can call them directly on 01902 424147 to

find out where the closest run sessions are taking place.

Alternatively, let the school office know if they attend Ducklings and you would like your child to take part in one of these sessions whilst they are at school. We can make a direct referral with your permission and if we submit enough referrals they will come in to the Ducklings setting to run the group. ### **Free School Meals**

Now we have started the new school year, it is a good time to check if you are eligible for Free School Meals. This especially applies to children who have recently joined the school, especially in Reception. Children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are eligible for Universal Free School Meals but the school will still receive extra money and benefits for children who are eligible to Income based Free School Meals. This means additional resources to support your child, including breakfast club access and some discounted school trips.

Your child may be able to get free school meals if you get any of the following:

- Income Support
- income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

Children who get paid these benefits directly, instead of through a parent or guardian, can also get free school meals.

If your child is eligible for free school meals, they'll remain eligible until they finish the phase of schooling (primary or secondary) they're in on 31 March 2022.

If you think you may be eligible simply visit

You will receive an instant answer when you apply which will be either a green tick or a red cross. If you received a green tick bring in confirmation to the office and we can record the entitlement straight away. Thank you.

## October is Walk to School Month!


Every October is International Walk to School Month – an opportunity for children to join hundreds of thousands of pupils across the globe celebrating the walk to school.

Staffordshire County Council are encouraging families to walk to school throughout October in order to improve health and fitness and help the environment;

- Do you know that walking to school instead of driving can save a family up to £400 a year?
- A 15-minute walk or cycle to and from school will provide your child with half of their recommended daily exercise.
- Research has proven that children who walk to school are more alert in the classroom
- Over a third of parents say that their walk to school is where they find the most out from their children.
